6/13 **Festival of the Red Rose** 10:30 am

Zion Lutheran Church of Manheim
2 South Hazel Street

The annual Festival of the Red Rose will be held at Zion Lutheran Church during the 10:30am worship service.

In 1892 the congregation began the Festival of the Red Rose by paying one red rose to an heir of Henry William Stiegel, founder of the town of Manheim. In 1772 Stiegel gave the Manheim Lutheran congregation land upon which to build a church. The deed required only the payment of "one red rose in the month of June, yearly forever hereafter, if the same shall be lawfully demanded." This provision in the deed was overlooked until 1892 when the congregation instituted the Festival of the Red rose during which it began giving, each year in the month of June a red rose to an heir of Stiegel.

This year's rose will be given to Margaret Flannigan-Badger of Deppford, NJ. A ninth generation Stiegel heir. The speaker for the service will be Pastor Sadie Pounder. For more information, please call 665-5880.
