The National Merit Scholarship Program is a prestigious academic award that recognizes high school students who exceed educational excellence.

Of the 1.5 million entrants, some 50,000 with the highest PSAT/NMSQT qualify for recognition in the National Merit Scholarship Program.

In February, approximately 15,000 semi finalist are an-

nounced. All winners of Merit Scholarship awards are chosen from the semi finalist group based on their abilities, skills, and accomplishments. A variety of information is available for selectors to evaluate the finalist's academic record, information about the school's curriculum and grading system, two sets of test scores, school official's written recommendation, student's activities and leadership and the finalist's own essay.
